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Strategic Overview

There has been an excellent response to the Shire's new Council Plan and approach to leadership and advocacy with community perceptions improving across all key performance areas tested.

The biggest improvements were:

- Understanding community needs (up 14% points)
- Clearly explaining reasons for decisions and how community views are considered (up 12% points)
- Listening to and respecting community views (up 9% points)

Results are even more positive among respondents who were aware of the new Council Plan. Among these respondents:

- Council's leadership improved by 16 index points
- Advocacy and lobbying improved by 15 index points
- Community consultation **improved** by 19 index points
- Understanding community needs **improved** by 20% points
- Listening to and respecting community views improved by 17% points
- Communication improved by 21 index points
- Clearly explaining reasons for decisions and how views are considered **improved** by 21% points
- Customer service improved by 19 index points

The Shire's performance is now above industry average in these areas.



Approach

The Study

CATALYSE[®] was commissioned to conduct a MARKYT[®] Community Scorecard PULSE with 300 residents on a sixmonthly basis to track community views on key issues.

The aim of this pulse was to assess how well the Shire of Mundaring has been listening and responding to community needs following adoption of a new Council Plan, and to assess the effectiveness of Council's new approaches in leadership and advocacy.

Email invitations were delivered to a random sample of 4,436 community members in the Shire's customer databases and the Shire provided supporting promotions through its communication channels.


The scorecard was open from 18 November to 2 December 2024.

363 residents participated in this pulse.

Responses were weighted by age and gender to match the ABS Census population profile.







Community variances between residents who were aware vs unaware of the Council Plan

Community members who were aware of the Shire's new Council Plan provided more positive ratings. They were more likely to agree that Council understands community needs, listens to and respect their views, and clearly explains reasons for decisions. They also provided higher performance ratings for Council's leadership, governance, advocacy, consultation, communication and customer service, and were more likely to have heard about the Shire's efforts to advocate for key projects.






Shire of Mundaring listens to and respects community views




